Since an active methodology is applied focused on the students, those students who, for justified reasons, follow the subject in the non-continuous evaluation modality must speak with the teacher during the hours set aside for tutorials and specify a work proposal that will include the Theoretical study of the documentation for each topic and an adequate plan related to the activities that allow the development of the competences included in the Teaching

Guide.
